The Chain of Lakes Blueway Trail Access Project will allow Intracoastal Waterway access to the 26 mile long Chain of Lakes freshwater canal and lake system in central Palm Beach County. One of South Florida's most picturesque waterways is also one of South Florida's best kept secrets? the Chain of Lakes, located in the heart of Palm Beach County. Lake Ida, Lake Eden, Lake Osborne, Lake Clarke, and Pine Lake, are all connected by waterways and canals, which make up the 26 miles of natural habitat areas known as the Chain of Lakes. While local residents with direct access are able to take advantage of the wide array of water activities, unfortunately, the Chain of Lakes is landlocked and unable to be accessed by the nearby Intracoastal Waterway, just a few hundred yards away. Now, local residents, marine enthusiasts and Palm Beach County are teaming up to finally create a new "link" in the Chain of Lakes, making it more accessible for all! As a result, a new Blueway Trail will be created as part of Palm Beach County's and Florida's vast Greenway and Blueway Trail System, which encourages ecotourism through environmental restoration and preservation. This visionary Blueway Trail Project will connect the Intracoastal Waterway to the Chain of Lakes by installing a two-way boat lift and portage for small boats and non-motorized watercrafts. Kayaking ? paddle boarding ? canoeing ? fishing ? the list goes on of water activities that will be enjoyed by residents and outdoor enthusiasts alike.

The entire Chain of Lakes Blueway Trail Access Project is expected to costs \$1,340,000 and provide approximately \$75,000,000 in increased property valuations, as well as a significant boost to the economic development potential of the approximately 200 acres of commercial, light industrial, and multi-family property in the immediate area as documented in a 2015 report by the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council done for the Palm Beach MPO. Anticipated commercial development includes retail for boating and water sports, boating maintenance and repair, housing with water access, retail for fishing and fishing supplies, and water accessible restaurants.

This appropriation request is for engineering analysis and design totaling \$286,900 for a boat lift at the S155 structure on the C51 Canal. Engineering design will cost \$249,500 and must include channel scour analysis, hydraulic analysis, geotechnical engineering and design, structural engineering and design, site survey and civil design, environmental review and preparation of a construction stormwater pollution prevention plan. An additional \$37,400 has been earmarked for

project management. To date, approximately \$62,000 has been spent by the local governments and the MPO on this project. The engineering design for this project is fairly complex and will be reviewed and approved by FDEP and the USACE before construction permits are issued. Discussions to date have been positive and all agencies support the project.

Support for this project is also coming from local municipalities, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (Resolution 2015-1865), Palm Beach County League of Cities, local business leaders, local fishing guides and snook fishing experts, non-motorized boating enthusiasts, environmentalists, various state agencies and NGOs.
