These dollars will provide direct support to our affiliates as pass-through grants and positions that work directly with and in support of the current affiliates. There are 8 operational local CIS affiliates serving 11 counties throughout the state (Bradford, Clay, Duval, Gadsden, Hernando, Leon, Miami-Dade, Nassau, Okeechobee, Palm Beach, Putnam and St. Johns). Each local affiliate has programs at a number of school sites, elementary through high school. We are currently serving 42,806 students at 85 school and community sites. Our local CIS Affiliates will use funds to continue services in existing schools and expand into new schools. Services and strategies include, but are not limited to: mentoring, tutoring, identifying and coordinating health services, parent engagement activities, after-school programs, clothes closets, food banks and weekend backpack programs, school supplies, teen-pregnancy programs, drug prevention programs, career readiness and exploration, college readiness and campus visits, and life skills that include time and financial management. These dollars would provide a matching grant to new communities to help them establish a local CIS Affiliate. The grant would support the activities that lead to the incorporation of an independent 501(c)(3) organization. These funds would allow us to serve approximately 50,000 more students.
