The St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce recently invested over \$100,000 in the creation of a comprehensive Economic Development Strategic Plan and among its findings was that one of St. Petersburg's primary target industries for new job creation was Data Analytics. Corporations like HSN, Catalina Marketing, and Valpak are among the nation's leaders in their respective analytics sectors, and jobs in this sector occur in South Pinellas at three times a higher rate than comparable metro areas across the nation. With those findings in mind we intend to create a comprehensive program for the support and development of that sector's economy, from attracting and retaining jobs at its highest-level employers, to the support and promotion of startups in the Data Analytics and Financial Technology sector.

This program of work will be a model of cooperation between the business community, local government, educational institutions (both K-12 and University/College) and workforce development boards. The goal is to create a Big Data Collaborative that brings together these diverse stakeholders to ensure that firms will be attracted to St. Petersburg, our largest employers retain & expand jobs in the region, and entrepreneurs are able to start & fund dynamic and innovative companies.

We will start by studying in detail what makes up St. Petersburg's Data Analytics Sector. This includes identifying the firms that work in this space, who they are employing, and what skills those employees possess. It will also include a comprehensive look at the entrepreneurial landscape around this sector. Finally, the study will analyze trends in the industries represented to help predict needs in the community, whether in infrastructure, workforce, or areas unforeseen at this time.

From there the Big Data Collaborative will meet regularly to create and implement strategies for addressing issues within the sector as well as work plans for the attraction, retention, and startup of Data Analytics firms.

The two primary metrics for success of this initiative are new above-average wage jobs created and capital invested in startups in the Data Analytics and Financial Technologies sectors. The first measure will take into account jobs realized from attracting businesses to the area, encouraging the expansion of existing businesses, and fostering the startup of entrepreneurial firms. The second measure will be a signifier for the success of individual firms and as a measure of the entrepreneurial ecosystem's efficacy in the support of targeted startups. Identifying a baseline for each metric as well as targets will be one of the primary outcomes of the data analytics study undertaken at the beginning of this initiative.
