**HOUSE HEALTH CARE APPROPRIATIONS / SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS
COMMUNITY-BASED CARE LEAD AGENCY CONFORMING BILL – FISCAL YEAR 2015-16**

	House Bill 11-A	House Offer #1	SB 2510-A
1		Senate	Section 1, part 1. (s. 409.991 (1), F.S.) Amends the equity allocation model used for the allocation of core services funds to the community-based care lead agencies (CBCs), to include “Proportion of the child population” rather than “Proportion of children in poverty.” Removes the component “Proportion of contribution in the reduction of out-of-home care.” Weights the component “Proportion of children in care” as 60% for out-of-home care and 40% for in-home care.
2		Senate	Section 1, part 2. (s. 409.991 (2), F.S.) Amends the weighting of the components of the equity allocation model as follows: Proportion of the child population: 5%; Proportion of child abuse hotline workload: 15%; and Proportion of children in care: 80%.
3	Section 1, (s. 409.991 (3), F.S.) Beginning in Fiscal Year 2015-2016, 95% of base core services funds will be based on prior year recurring base core services funding, and 5% will be redistributed based on the equity allocation model. (Under current law, 90% of recurring base core services funds are based on prior year recurring base core services funding, and 10% are redistributed based on the equity allocation model.)	Senate	Section 1, part 3. (s. 409.991 (3), F.S.) Beginning in Fiscal Year 2015-2016, there will be no adjustment to the recurring base core services funding. (Under current law, 90% of recurring base core services funds are based on prior-year recurring base core services funding, and 10% are redistributed based on the equity allocation model.)
4		Senate	Section 1, part 4. (s. 409.991 (4), F.S.) Unless otherwise specified in the GAA, new core services funds will be allocated based on the equity allocation model as follows: 20% among all CBCs; 80% among only CBCs that are funded below their equitable share, as determined by the equity allocation model.
5	Section 2. Creates s. 414.455, F.S. to require the DCF to obtain legislative authorization before seeking, applying for, or accepting federal waivers to the work requirement for SNAP eligibility.	House	
6	Section 3. The bill takes effect July 1, 2015.	Identical	Section 2. The bill takes effect July 1, 2015.
New Issue Offered by Senate for CBC Conforming Bill			
7		Senate	Language to Ensure Special Session Consistency with Regular Session: “If any law amended by this act was also amended by a law enacted during the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature, such laws shall be construed as if enacted during the same session of the Legislature, and full effect shall be given to each if possible.”
